



#### **FAAP** Initiative

Key ideas/principles underlying the Initiative

- 1. <u>Similar socioeconomic and health-related needs and challenges</u> as well as geographic proximity as an underlying factors for close collaboration between Participants
- 2. Focus on facilitation of access to effective and affordable medicinal products for the service of citizens of the countries involved
- 3. FAAP initiative should be perceived as a <u>complementary, missing element allowing better proactive preparation</u> <u>of local reimbursement systems for innovation</u> (regional topic-specific reimbursement strategy)
- 4. Focus on <u>certain modalities of pricing</u> any variables which specify the availability of medicinal products within national reimbursement system e.g.: clinical characteristics of patients, length of treatment, expected reimbursement mechanism, financial conditions etc.
- 5. <u>The Memorandum</u> which constitutes the legal basis for the FAAP initiative <u>is not intended to create any legal</u> <u>obligations under domestic or international law</u>.

## Fair and affordable pricing (FAAP) **SUMMARY**

- The ultimate goal of FAP initiative is the development of methods and modalities of cooperation and negotiations with MAHs concerning pricing of certain medicinal technologies in order to improve and facilitate access to effective and affordable medicinal products on V4+ level.
- Above can be delivered through long-time cooperation focused on:
  - Building an active institutional network within the region
  - Exchange of expertise and experience in the field of reimbursement and pricing
  - Common assessment of desired options for treatment management
- Taking learning-by-doing / pilot approach the process assumes preparation of <u>coherent regional negotiation</u> <u>strategy</u> of development of public reimbursement system for specific disease area, which could stand as guidelines for national processes
- Pilot process should allow to build recommendation on development an International Agreement concerning fair pricing

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
